- **4.** Why do you think Derrick gets nervous when his sister buys him "good" paper to draw his comics on? Do you think it puts more pressure on him to do well?
- Doug reveals that Derrick hasn't told him much about his mom. Why do you think Derrick chooses not to tell his friends about her? Do you think talking about her and her drinking problem would help him?
- **6.** Why do you think Max finally decides to write about his mom in the comic?
- **7.** How does plastic harm the environment? What are some things we can do to reduce the amount of plastic that ends up in the ocean?
- **8.** What do you think Derrick's mom means when she calls Max's urn a "crutch?" Why do you think he holds on to it? Do you think it's a bad thing that he still has it?
- **9.** Do you agree with Derrick's mom that it's time for him to move on from Max?
- **10.** What do you think the overall message of the book is? What did you learn from reading it?
